"Loving God, Loving People"

MIHE On the first day of the new year many of us wish each other a "Happy New Year!", but as we begin a new year, we need more than a hopeful greeting from the people around us. We need to N hear what God told Joshua more than thirty-four hundred years ago. As Joshua was about to lead God's people into the Promised Land, he had reason to be afraid of what the future held. He had an enormous task ahead of him, and he was well aware of the dangers that he and the people he was leading would soon be facing. Joshua needed God's encouragement. At the dawn of a new year of uncertainties, we too need God's encouragement. Even in a non-pandemic era, a new year brings many troubling questions: Will our health holdup? Will our marriage last? Will we be able to hang onto our jobs? Will we get into the right school? Will we live to see the end of 2022? Will the economy improve? Will there be another terrorist attack or some natural disaster that directly affects us or our loved ones? In the midst of the current pandemic, new questions arise: Will we get covid and if so, we will survive? Will we have to wear masks forever? Will the supply chain issues improve? Will inflation reduce or eliminate our retirement accounts? In the midst of all these questions, the Creator of the universe comes to us and says, "... Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." [Joshua 1:9, NRSV] As the people of God, we need to understand that what happens in this coming year is not left to random fate; God is in charge and He promises to stay close to us—"... the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Many centuries later, the Lord Jesus made the same promise when He said, "... I am with you always," [Matthew 28:20, NRSV] The promises of God are why we can wish each other a "Happy New Year!"

Before 2021 gets lost in our "rearview mirror", I want to again express my deep gratitude for the financial generosity of this congregation. Though all the data has not yet been calculated (We have not yet received the church's December's bank statement and therefore cannot officially close out the year.), I can say in complete confidence that we will conclude the 2021 financial year in the black. This is significant for three major reasons: 1) God has again proved Himself to be generous; 2) as a congregation, we have again shown ourselves to be faithful; and 3) the 2021 budget was the largest in my tenure here. I said to both our *Stewardship and Finance Committee* and our *Session* during the budgeting process my first year here and every year thereafter that God has committed Himself to supply everything we need to accomplish what He desires us to achieve. This requires us to submit our will to God's will and then watch God work in our lives. What is true in our financial life is also true in our whole life. To God be the glory—great things He hath done!" [*To God Be the Glory*]

Lastly, I will not be in the office this Friday, January 7th. Joanna and I will be in Alabama celebrating one of our grandson's seventh birthday. We will travel down on Thursday evening and return Saturday night. We will be in church Sunday morning and hope to see you there, as well.


